Bengt Sahlberg received his Ph.D. in Social and Economic Geography from Lund University in Sweden 1970. He worked at the Nordic Institute for Studies in Urban and Regional Planning in Stockholm as research leader between 1974 and 1986. His research covered areas as networks and communication, IT and remote work, carpooling and transport planning.

In 1986 he was appointed Executive Vice President and Director of Research and Development at the Swedish Tourist Board.

1990 he became Scandinavia's first professor in Tourism at Mid Sweden University in Östersund and during 1992 he was appointed Deputy Vice Chancellor. 1994/95 he became chairman of the faculty of social sciences. Bengt Sahlberg is one of the founders of European Tourism Research Institute in Östersund and has been a member of the board of directors since 1997.

In 2002 he became guest professor at the University College Södertörns högskola in the south of Stockholm.

His last three books in tourism are Kings, Calamities and Condiments (1998); Meetings, Men and Markets (2001); Roots, Rites and Roles (2004).

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
